BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WADSWORTH, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. This council hereby approves changing the zoning district classification of Permanent Parcel Number now known as 038-17B-20-033 also now known as 778 Akron Road from the existing Wadsworth Township Zoning District Classification to the City of Wadsworth R-1 Residential District Zoning Classification upon annexation into the City of Wadsworth by Resolution No. 21-03.

WEST OF SR57) IN THE CITY OF WADSWORTH IN MEDINA COUNTY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WADSWORTH, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That this Council finds it to be in the public interest to consent and does give consent to the Ohio Director of Transportation (ODOT) to complete the above described project.

Section 2. That this Council agrees that the City of Wadsworth shall cooperate with the Ohio Director of Transportation (ODOT), for the portion of the above described project within the Wadsworth Corporation Limit, as follows:

1. ODOT agrees to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of the project costs.
2. The City of Wadsworth will be responsible for one hundred percent (100%) of the total cost for added construction items requested by the City and not necessary for the improvement as determined by the State and the Federal Highway Administration;

Section 3. That this Council agrees that the City of Wadsworth shall be responsible for all utility accommodations, relocation and reimbursement and that all such accommodations, relocations and reimbursements shall comply with current provisions of 23 CFR 645 and the ODOT Utilities Manual.

If other public and private utilities need to be relocated due to this ODOT project they will not be reimbursed for relocation; with exceptions due to an easement, etc.

Section 4. That the Director of Public Service is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with the Ohio Director of Transportation agreeing to the terms as set forth in this ordinance.

Section 5. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety in the City of Wadsworth in order to expedite a highway project necessary to promote highway safety;

WHEREFORE, this ordinance shall go into immediate effect provided that it receives a two thirds vote of all members of city council. If it receives approval by a majority of the members but less than a two-thirds vote, then it shall be effective at the earliest time permitted by law.
