ORDINANCE NO. 23-053

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH A NEW SPECIAL REVENUE FUND KNOWN AS "SAFETY TOWN VILLAGE" FUND FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACCUMULATING RESOURCES FOR THE SAFETY TOWN VILLAGE AND 9/11 MEMORIAL PROJECT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, section 5705.12 of the Ohio Revised Code provides that in addition to the funds provided for by sections 5705.09, 5705.121, 5705.13 and 5705.131 of the Revised Code, the taxing authority of a subdivision may establish, with the approval of and in the manner prescribed by the auditor of state, such other funds as are desirable and may provide by ordinance or resolution that money derived from specified sources other than the general property tax shall be paid directly into such funds, and

WHEREAS, the City of Wadsworth anticipates receiving ongoing donations and sponsorships to help fund improvements and maintain the Safety Town Village and 9/11 Memorial and it is desirable to establish a fund to account for and hold money needed to meet the obligation to pay such expenditures, NOW THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WADSWORTH, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That this Council, pursuant to section 5705.12 of the Ohio Revised Code, hereby establishes a Safety Town Village Fund as a new special revenue fund to hold money for payment of improvements and maintenance of the Safety Town Village and 9/11 Memorial provided that the establishment of said fund is approved by the auditor of state as provided by law.

Section 2. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety in the City of Wadsworth in order to benefit the children of Wadsworth and honor the victims of 9/11; WHEREFORE, this ordinance shall go into immediate effect provided that it receives a two thirds vote of all members of city council. If it receives approval by a majority of the members but less than a two-thirds vote, then it shall be effective at the earliest time permitted by law.
