**AN ORDINANCE DETERMINING TO PROCEED WITH REPAIRING,
REPLACING OR CONSTRUCTING OF CERTAIN SIDEWALKS IN THE CITY
OF WADSWORTH**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WADSWORTH, STATE
OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the repair, replacement or construction of sidewalks as the implementation of the 2020-2021 City Sidewalk Repair Program, which is conducive to the public convenience and welfare in accordance with plans, specifications and estimates of costs and profiles on file in the office of the Director of Public Service and on file with the Clerk of Council in accordance with Resolution No. 21-06, passed by council on the 16th day of March, 2021.

SECTION 2. That the estimated assessments of the cost of said improvement heretofore prepared and filed in the office of said Clerk and the same are hereby adopted.

SECTION 3. That it is further determined that the cost of said improvement to be assessed against benefited property shall be assessed in the amount, manner and number of installments as provided for in said Resolution declaring the necessity of said improvement.

SECTION 4. That bonds of the City of Wadsworth shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of assessments by the installments and in an amount equal thereto, and notes of said City of Wadsworth shall be issued in anticipation of the issue of such bonds.

SECTION 5. That since no claims for damages or objections to benefited or abutting land owners have been filed, or in the event of such filing have been resolved and settled according to law, that no judicial inquiry shall be necessary prior to commencement of this improvement.

SECTION 6. That the Director of Public Service is authorized to advertise for and receive bids and to enter into a contract for the aforesaid implementation of the 2020-2021 City Sidewalk Repair Program. The payment obligation of said contract shall not exceed \$150,000. If it becomes necessary after the contract is entered into, to authorize change orders, such change orders may be authorized so long as the total financial obligation of the city pursuant to the contract including change orders does not exceed the awarded bid amount plus ten percent of the awarded bid amount.

SECTION 7. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to deliver a certified copy of this Ordinance to the Medina County Auditor within fifteen days after its adoption.

SECTION 8. This ordinance shall go into immediate effect pursuant to section 731.30 of the Ohio Revised Code, as being an ordinance to complete the legislation to make and pay for a public improvement, being subsequent to Resolution 21-06, the first measure required to be passed in regard to said public improvement.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 34.161 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES TO PROVIDE FOR AN ADDITIONAL CITY INCOME TAX OF ONE-TENTH OF ONE PERCENT FOR TEN YEARS FOR THE PURPOSE OF STREET IMPROVEMENTS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WADSWORTH, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Section 34.161 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Wadsworth, Ohio, is hereby amended as follows:

§ 34.161 Additional Income Tax for Street Improvements

All income taxable under Section 34.16 of the Codified Ordinances, shall, on and after January 1, 2022 until and including December 31, 2031 be subject to an additional income tax of one-tenth of one percent which is levied to provide funds for street improvements of the city.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be submitted for approval by the electors of the municipality as provided in Section 718.01 of the Ohio Revised Code and, if approved, shall be in full force and effect on and after January 1, 2022 until and including December 31, 2031.

Section 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety in the City of Wadsworth in order to provide funding to support the current level of fire and emergency medical service in the City of Wadsworth; WHEREFORE, this ordinance shall go into immediate effect provided that it receives a two thirds vote of all members of city council. Section 2. That this Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3. A RESOLUTION SPECIFYING THE DATE THE ELECTION IS TO BE HELD ON ORDINANCE NO. 21-044 DIRECTING THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS OF MEDINA COUNTY, OHIO, TO CONDUCT THE ELECTION, PROVIDING FOR THE FORM OF BALLOT, DIRECTING THE CLERK OF COUNCIL TO FILE A COPY OF ORDINANCE NO. 21-044 AND A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION WITH SAID BOARD OF ELECTIONS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Section 718.01 of the Ohio Revised Code provides that no municipal corporation shall levy a tax on income in excess of one percent without having obtained the approval of the excess by a majority of the electors of the municipality voting on the question at a general, primary or special election; and

WHEREAS, Section 718.01 of the Ohio Revised Code further provides that the legislative authority of the municipal corporation shall file a copy of the Ordinance with the Board of Elections, together with a Resolution specifying the date of the election is to be held and directing the Board of Elections to conduct the election; and

WHEREAS, this Council has adopted Ordinance No.21-044 to provide for the levy of a tax on income in excess of one percent; **NOW THEREFORE**

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WADSWORTH, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That this Council hereby specifies the General Election of November 2, 2021 as the date the election is to be held on Ordinance No. 21-044 and hereby directs the Board of Elections of Medina County, Ohio to conduct such election in accordance with all applicable laws.

Section 2. That it is the desire of this Council that the ballot presented to the electors of the City of Wadsworth shall be substantially in the following form:

Shall the Ordinance providing for the continuation of an existing one-tenth of one percent levy on income for a period of ten years commencing January 1, 2022 for the purpose of providing funds for street improvements of the City be passed?

FOR THE INCOME TAX
AGAINST THE INCOME TAX

Section 3. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to file a copy of Ordinance No. 21-044 and a copy of this Resolution with the Board of Elections of Medina County, Ohio.

Section 4. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety in the City of Wadsworth in order to permit Ordinance No. 21-044 to be submitted to the electors at the General Election of November 2, 2021, and to allow sound financial planning for the future by the City of Wadsworth; WHEREFORE, this resolution shall go into immediate effect.

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY OF IMPROVING THE PHASE 2 – SOUTHWEST PARKING LOT WITH CONCRETE PAVEMENT; INTERLOCKING PAVERS; LANDSCAPING; STORM SEWER; PRIVATE SIDEWALKS, DECKING, STEPS, PARKING AREAS, DRIVEWAYS, PATIOS, ADA ACCESSIBLE RAMPS, DOWNSPOUTS, AND LANDSCAPING; GRADING; SIDEWALK; CURBING; REPAIRS TO THE PHASE 1 – SOUTHWEST PARKING LOT; AND OTHER SURFACE IMPROVEMENTS IN THE CITY OF WADSWORTH AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WADSWORTH, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That it is necessary to improve the Phase 2 – Southwest Parking Lot project with concrete pavement; interlocking pavers; landscaping; storm sewer; private sidewalks, decking, steps, parking areas, driveways, patios, ADA Accessible ramps, downspouts, and landscaping; grading; sidewalk; curbing; repairs to the Phase 1 – Southwest Parking Lot; and other surface improvements in the City of Wadsworth in accordance with plans, specifications and estimates of cost therefore prepared by the City Engineer and now on file in the office of the Clerk of Council. The lots or parcels of land to be assessed for the improvement shall be those listed on the attached Exhibit A.

Section 2. Said assessments shall be levied in proportion to the benefits which may result from the improvements and shall be paid, when levied, in ten (10) annual installments, with no interest on unpaid installments; provided however, that the owner of any property assessed may, at their option pay such assessment in cash within thirty (30) days after passage of this ordinance levying such assessments. The remainder of the cost of said improvements after the application of the assessments herein provided for shall be provided by the issuance of bonds as provided by law or from other funds available and appropriated for such purpose.

Section 3. That the Clerk of this Council is directed to cause a written notice of the passage of this resolution to be served on such property owners as required by law.

Section 4. That the plans, specifications and estimates of cost for said repair, replacement or construction of such sidewalks as heretofore filed are hereby approved.

Section 5. That this resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, safety and welfare in the City of Wadsworth in order to expedite the improvement of unsafe sidewalk; WHEREFORE, this resolution shall go into immediate effect provided that it receives a two thirds vote of all members of city council. If it receives approval by a majority of the members but less than a two-thirds vote, then it shall be effective at the earliest time permitted by law.

RESOLUTION NO. 21-10

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF VARIOUS ITEMS OF PERSONAL PROPERTY BY INTERNET AUCTION PURSUANT TO RESOLUTION 21-02 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, this Council has previously adopted Resolution 21-02 pursuant to section 721.15(D) of the Ohio Revised Code regarding the sale of city owned personal property by internet auction which provided that items of personal property may be sold pursuant to that resolution when said items are authorized to be sold by subsequent resolution of this Council, and

WHEREAS, this Council has determined that various items of personal property owned by the City of Wadsworth are not needed for public use or are obsolete or unfit for the use for which they were acquired and should be sold by internet auction pursuant to Resolution 21-02;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WADSWORTH, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That pursuant to Section 2 of Resolution 21-02, this Council hereby authorizes the sale of the various items of personal property listed on Exhibit A attached to this ordinance by internet auction in the manner provided for in Resolution 21-02 and authorizes a contract with Public Surplus to conduct said internet auction.

Section 2. That this resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety in the City of Wadsworth in order to avoid the burden of keeping property no longer needed for municipal purposes and to obtain additional funds for use in providing public services; WHEREFORE, this resolution shall go into immediate effect provided that it receives a two thirds vote of all members of city council. If it receives approval by a majority of the members but less than a two-thirds vote, then it shall be effective at the earliest time permitted by law.
