AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO NEGOTIATE AND ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN AND ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR THE NEW FIRE STATION HEADQUARTERS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WADSWORTH, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Director of Public Safety is hereby authorized to negotiate and enter into an agreement for professional architectural design and engineering services for the new fire station headquarters.

Section 2. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were passed in an open meeting of this council, and that all deliberations of this council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety in the City of Wadsworth in order to expedite the design of the new fire station headquarters; WHEREFORE, this ordinance shall go into immediate effect provided that it receives a two thirds vote of all members of city council. If it receives approval by a majority of the members but less than a two-thirds vote, then it shall be effective at the earliest time permitted by law.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO SELL PERSONAL PROPERTY ACQUIRED AS CONTENTS FROM THE PURCHASE OF REAL PROPERTY WHICH IS NOT NEEDED FOR MUNICIPAL PURPOSES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WADSWORTH, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That pursuant to section 721.15 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Director of Public Safety is hereby authorized to sell personal property not needed for municipal purposes which was acquired as contents from the purchase of real property. Said property shall be sold at public auction after advertisement for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Wadsworth or via internet auction pursuant to Resolution 21-02. The Director of Public Safety may enter into a Personal Property Auction Sale Agreement for said public auction under which the Auctioneer shall receive a commission not to exceed 8% of the gross proceeds of the sale payable from the proceeds of said auction.

Section 2. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety in the City of Wadsworth in order to dispose of unneeded property and obtain needed funds; WHEREFORE, this ordinance shall go into immediate effect provided that it receives a two thirds vote of all members of city council. If it receives approval by a majority of the members but less than a two-thirds vote, then it shall be effective at the earliest time permitted by law.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH VASU FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE REMAINING DIGITAL EMERGENCY RADIO SYSTEM EQUIPMENT AND INSTALLATION SERVICES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, this Council by its Ordinance No. 20-097 passed on November 4, 2020 authorized the purchase of digital emergency radio system equipment and from VASU; NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WADSWORTH, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Director of Public Safety is hereby authorized and directed to enter into an agreement with VASU for the purchase for the remaining digital emergency radio system equipment and installation services, at a total cost not to exceed \$282,000.00.

Section 2. That this Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety in the City of Wadsworth in order to provide portable and digital emergency radios for the city's first responders; WHEREFORE, this ordinance shall go into immediate effect provided it receives a two thirds vote of all members of city council. If it receives approval by a majority of the members but less than a two-thirds vote, then it shall be effective at the earliest time permitted by law.
