



# Friends bringing aid to N.C.

WADSWORTH — Early Saturday morning two friends left Wadsworth with a truckload of supplies going to assist communities in North Carolina that were affected by Hurricane Helene.

Wadsworth Community Television's Ayden Usinski and his friend Ean Tanko are heading to areas in North Carolina with a truck full of supplies to assist communities and people affected by Hurricane Helene, a Category 4 storm that swept across several states in late September.

"I started seeing a lot of stuff on social media," Usinski said. "I started seeing the effects of what had happened and how it was a disaster, and how awful the situation was."

After seeing everything going on he asked Tanko if he wanted to drive down and help. Deciding to collect some supplies to take with them the pair was shocked at what was collected.

"We weren't even expecting to get this many donations," Usinski said.

"I was like I'll put the word out there whatever we get we get, and however we can help whether it's cooking foods, or sorting supplies, or cleaning up. However, we can help we just wanted to."

The spontaneous supplies collection quickly grew. Usinski said the plan was originally to use Tanko's Subaru Crosstrek, but supplies kept flooding in. He said the city eventually provided a city pickup truck so the pair could transport more supplies south. They collected enough to fill three or four pickup trucks. The remaining supplies were transported to the Akron Fulton Airport for American Winds College of Aeronautics to take it down.

Usinski and Tanko left early Saturday morning to begin the nine-hour drive to their first location in North Carolina.

"There are big organizations that are having volunteers sign up," he said. "There's a ton of Facebook groups, kind of like our Wadsworth Neighbors, every day they are asking for help at every church, every school, and every local area."

Usinski said this could not have been done without the support of the community and all of those who donated or shared his posts. He said people came to support the cause from all over the county.

"We were just planning on going to help and bring what we could, but because of the community we were able to fill truckloads, just because of their generous donations," he said.

Usinski said there is so much to do that there are multiple groups asking for volunteers. He and Tanko are going to help out where they can until they make their return trip to Wadsworth on Wednesday morning.



